Jim Schlesinger forwards ideas on what we might do to combat Arab terrorism. (A paper on what to do about Qadhafi in Libya follows.

He makes specific proposals for domestic action, "big power" or bilateral collaboration, and present and possible CIA unilateral action. The aim is to discredit the terrorists, destroy their morale and effectiveness, and preserve an atmosphere for peaceful settlement of the Israeli-Arab dispute.

SANITIZED

None of these proposals promises a dramatic solution to the problem of Arab terrorism, but together they offer a substantial attack against such terrorism at little risk.

Some of these operations are in motion; others the CIA can implement immediately. There are some which Schlesinger proposes to pursue via the Cabinet Committee on Terrorism or the 40 Committee and he notes that your endorsement would accelerate action by these groups.

RECOMMENDATION:

That you sign the letter to Mr. Schlesinger (TAB A) giving your general endorsement to Schlesinger's proposals, and encouraging him to implement those for which his Agency has policy approval, and to solicit Cabinet Committee on Terrorism, 40 Committee or such other approvals as may be necessary to implement others.

A RESPONSE TO ARAB TERRORISM

Basic objectives of the United States toward the Palestinian terrorist movement should be:

- A. To identify the leaders of this movement as unprincipled and irresponsible criminals and outlaws, and to deprive them of all plausible claim to legitimacy as representatives of the Palestinian people.
- B. To stimulate opposition to this movement on the part of governments, public opinion makers, and populations, particularly in the Arab world.
- C. To destroy the morale, organizational cohesion, and operational effectiveness of the terrorist movement.
- D. To prevent its actions from damaging United States relations with the Arab governments and destroying an atmosphere in which a peaceful settlement of the Arab-Israeli dispute may be possible.

These objectives can best be accomplished through cooperative and collaborative actions by all governments which in varying ways and in varying degrees stand to be hurt by terrorist activities. Such collaboration should take place both on the diplomatic level and, where liaisons exist, on the level of security services.

Because innocent people of any country can be harmed in a terrorist action, whether it be along the lines of the Khartoum incident, an aircraft hijacking or demolition, or wanton terrorism on the street, there does exist common cause. This must be appealed to now when the horror of Khartoum is still fresh in mind.

Everything possible must be done to make the cost of a terrorist actias high as possible to would-be perpetrators of terrorism. So long as effective deterrents do not exist,



terrorism will prosper. Fear of punishment and retaliation should be instilled in the terrorist movement, and their failures publicized. This outside pressure should be supplemented

Arab terrorism is one product of the ever-festering Arab-Israeli dispute. It is a tempting tactic and one all too commonly applauded by Arabs. Until this conflict is somehow resolved, however, it should be our objective to show that terrorism, however gratifying as a vent for frustration, lessens the likelihood of a Middle Eastern solution, harms the Arab image in the world, and lessens the chances of a solution favorable to the Arabs.


